Oil pastel is a relatively new medium for drawing and painting. Originally created for students in Japan, it became a professional medium when famous artists like Pablo Picasso started using oil pastel for works on different surfaces. Oil pastel is a very unique medium - neither an oil paint, nor pastel, but it combines the best qualities of both. We will introduce techniques for this medium, give basics of flower drawings and focus on using oil pastel for creating blown-up images of a tulip.



Each student will complete a drawing
on 19x24 Canson Mi-Teintes paper.

Luba Sterlikova has participated in over 80 exhibits in the USA, Russia, Europe and Asia.
